DESCRIPTION

The Edexcel Level 2 BTEC First Certificate is a 3 unit qualification which offers a bite-sized opportunity for learners to experience a vocational qualification. The BTEC First Certificate offers a focused vocational qualification for learners who wish to follow a shorter programme of study related to an aspect of employment that they might wish to move into; or a taster qualification which can extend their programme of study and provide an initial experience of a vocational area. This will also enable learners to progress to a higher level qualification relevant to the sector.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

Over the course of a one year programme students will complete one compulsory unit and two other optional units which combine to make up the full award for the qualification. **The UK Travel and Tourism Industry** looks at organisations and structures that are used to delivery travel and tourism products and services to the consumers. **Exploring Customer Service in the Travel and Tourism Industry** looks at how organisations provide customer services to customers and to experience how this is carries out using role play situations.

As well as these compulsory units, an additional unit is studied which cover other areas of travel and tourism theory. **UK Travel and Tourism Destinations** looks at different types of destinations and features of travel around the UK as well as organising travel and tourism products and services for different user groups within the UK to meet a given brief.

WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

Students intending to study BTEC First Certificate Travel and Tourism usually do so with the objective of supplementing their existing GCSE achievements. It would usually mean that students studying these courses will have achieved mostly grades D-G within the studies at Key Stage 4 and would look to expand their choices for later study through completing these courses.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

All units completed contribute to the overall grade for the qualification. The qualification is awarded out of Pass, Merit and Distinction grades which are roughly equivalent to two GCSEs which are equivalent to grades CC – A*A* depending upon the overall grade achieved. All units are assessed through a coursework portfolio and there are no examinations that are sat at any stage of the course. The overall final grade is made up of the achievements of all units collated together.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

In terms of financial cost there may be trips and study visits organised in order to supplement the work that is taking place within each unit being studied. In terms of time costs it is expected that students are constantly working on portfolios throughout the duration of the course in order to achieve the best possible mark for each unit completed. This would therefore mean studying and completing work away from lessons in order to meet the regular deadlines that would be put in place.

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES?

Through studying Travel and Tourism students will use this to either move directly into working within the sector or allowing them to gain entry onto Level 3 programmes offered within the school. Students choosing the employment route have gone into a range of posts within travel and tourism organisations at various levels which they have applied to. In terms of Level 3 study, students have gone on to study other Business related courses including AS Business Studies and the Business, Administration and Finance Diploma as well as BTEC National Travel and Tourism.
